



The Tax Department has extended the expiration date for 19th Series highway use tax permits and *Certificates of Registration* until further notice

Previously, these permits and certificates were to be renewed by December 31, 2008. The new deadline to renew will be provided in the near future.

If you are already enrolled in OSCAR (*One Stop Credentialing and Registration*), your current OSCAR password will be your OSCAR renewal password. If you are not currently enrolled in OSCAR, a renewal password will be mailed to you prior to renewal in order to facilitate renewal on the OSCAR Web site. In the meantime, do the following:

- **Make sure you've paid your taxes.** We can't issue you a new certificate if you owe back taxes. Before you apply to renew, check to make sure that you've paid all amounts due under any of the taxes and impositions administered by the Tax Department, which includes but is not limited to, personal income tax, highway use tax, International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA), sales tax, and withholding tax.
- **Make sure you've filed all your Highway Use Tax Returns (Form(s) MT-903).**
- **Make sure your vehicle registration information is current and accurate.** You must provide identifying information, including license plate number and jurisdiction, for all the vehicles that require a certificate.
 - Visit OSCAR at www.oscar.state.ny.us to enter your information.
 - To use OSCAR, you'll need a United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) number and a New York State taxpayer identification number.
 - You can use OSCAR to remove any vehicles from your account that you no longer use.
- **Enroll in OSCAR now.**
