



**New York State Grants Relief for
Certain Taxpayers in Ulster County**

President George W. Bush has declared the county of Ulster a disaster area due to the April 14-18, 2007 storm. As a result of the declaration, Acting Commissioner Barbara G. Billet has further postponed certain New York tax filing and payment deadlines for taxpayers who were directly affected by the April storm and related flooding that occurred in Ulster County beginning on April 14, 2007.

Accordingly, the relief described in Important Notice N-07-9, *Announcement Regarding the April Storm Affecting Orange, Rockland, and Westchester Counties*, also applies to taxpayers who were directly affected by the April storm and related flooding that occurred in Ulster County.

As a result of this latest addition and the additional counties added by Important Notice N-07-10, *New York State Grants Relief for Certain Taxpayers in Albany, Dutchess, and Richmond Counties*, the relief described in N-07-9 now applies to the following counties: Albany, Dutchess, Orange, Richmond, Rockland, Ulster, and Westchester.
